

TO: Corbin Eisenmenger, an Investigator with the Lincoln Police Department, Lancaster County, Nebraska, and any and all law enforcement officers.

WHEREAS, Corbin Eisenmenger has filed an Affidavit before the undersigned Judge of the County Court of Lancaster County, Nebraska, and said written Affidavit, having been duly considered, the court finds that the facts set forth in said Affidavit are true, and that those facts do constitute grounds and probable cause for the issuance of a Search Warrant.

THEREFORE, you are commanded to search 4230 W St, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska which is described as a one-story home on the north side of W St between N 42nd St and N 44th St. The numbers 4230 are present on the front face of the house to the left of the front door. You are additionally commanded to search the black 2014 model year Ford Focus assigned vehicle identification number 1FADP3F29EL334045 and assigned Nebraska license plate number YYR680.


Law enforcement is authorized to the following items:



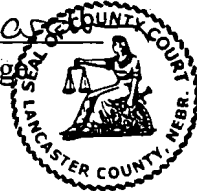
Your Affiant is authorized to measure, photograph, video tape, and seize the aforementioned items and may access any locked room or container which reasonable force may be used to enter.

On March 8, 2024 Affiant conducted a voluntary interview with B.H.'s father, Robert Herbert (DOB August 18, 1989). Robert reported he and B.H.'s mother, Jamy Dietz (DOB June 7, 1994), were the only two people to care for B.H. since her birth. He denied B.H. had suffered any falls such as from a bed or changing table. He explained he believed B.H. had suffered the rib fractures from either having been stepped on by their Siberian Husky or him having swaddled her too tight. He demonstrated, with a doll, having applied significant pressure to B.H. after he laid her on her side while wrapping her in a blanket. He also reported he had assisted B.H. when she seemed to have difficulty defecating. He again demonstrated lifting B.H.'s legs towards her stomach or torso before he squeezed her legs and torso together in an attempt to help her defecate or "pass gas". Robert made mention he had possibly squeezed B.H. too tight when doing this.

Robert also reported an incident approximately two weeks prior to the interview in which he was dismantling their child safety seat to clean it. While pulling on a piece of the cover to remove it from the seat, the cover suddenly came loose from the seat. Robert reported he accidentally struck B.H. in the head with the seat after the cover gave way as he was standing near or over B.H. while she was being held by Jamy. He stated B.H. had cried briefly and he did not see any visible injury.

Robert reported during the day of March 2, 2024, B.H. seemed to have congestion in her nose and mouth. He attempted to use a "booger sucker" to remove the cause of the congestion. He reported he was successful in removing a significant amount of congestion and had also used the "booger sucker" to blow air into her nose in hopes of forcing the congestion through her nasal passage into her mouth so it could be either removed or swallowed. He reported he had additionally attempted to use some saline solution to relieve the congestion. During this time, he found B.H. had appeared to stop breathing and her face was turning blue. He alerted Jamy and they transported her to Bryan East Hospital at 1600 S 48<sup>th</sup> St before she was ultimately transferred to Children's Hospital in Omaha, Nebraska.

During Robert's interview Jamy was simultaneously interviewed by Investigator Belleci #1899. Jamy described how Robert would bring B.H.'s legs up to her chest area and hold her whole body and then squeeze her to help her poop. She ultimately reported she had seen Robert put B.H. in this position and squeeze B.H. to the point his arms were shaking. She reported Friday, March 1, 2024, was when Robert had struck B.H. in the head with the child safety seat. She stated it



appeared he had deliberately struck B.H. out of frustration. Jamy reported that on March 2, 2024, the day they went to the emergency room with B.H. because she was having difficulty breathing, Robert had been forcing water into B.H.'s nose trying to clear her congestion until she began to choke and turned blue in the face.

Affiant consulted with medical staff of Children's Hospital following B.H.'s care and the interviews conducted with B.H.'s parents. They concluded the history initially provided by the parents were not reasonable explanations for the injuries observed on B.H.. The medical staff also concluded that the principal problem for B.H. was "non-accidental traumatic injury". They expressed the mechanisms later described by Jamy during her interview with Investigator Belleci could reasonably explain B.H.'s injuries. The incidents described by both Robert and Jamy as what caused B.H. injury and medical distress all took place within the basement residence of 4230 W St, Lincoln, Nebraska.

Jamy and Robert utilized a black 2014 Ford Focus with vehicle identification number 1FADP3F29EL334045 and assigned Nebraska license plate number YYR680 for transportation. This vehicle was observed on surveillance video from Bryan East Campus to be the vehicle they utilized to transport B.H. to the hospital.

The above does constitute grounds of probable cause for the issuance of a Search Warrant for 4230 W St, Lincoln, Lancaster County, Nebraska which is described as a one-story home on the north side of W St between N 42<sup>nd</sup> St and N 44<sup>th</sup> St. The numbers 4230 are present on the front face of the house to the left of the front door, as well as the black 2014 model year Ford Focus assigned vehicle identification number 1FADP3F29EL334045 and assigned Nebraska license plate number YYR680 for the following items:
